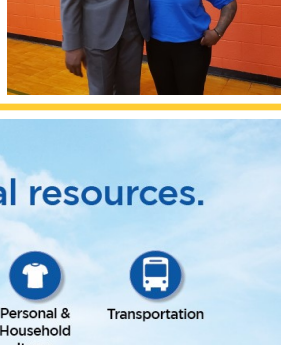
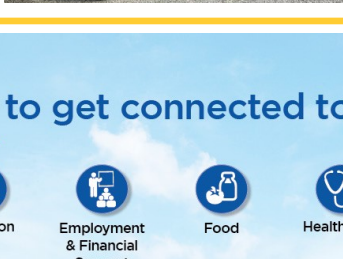
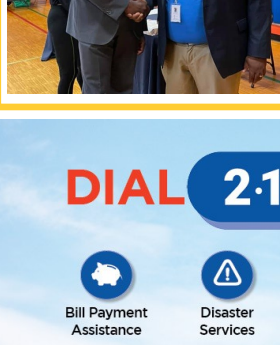

Over the last quarter, our agency has been very busy in spite of our building being closed to the public.

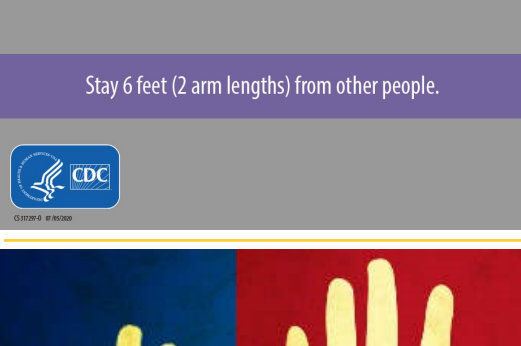
Here at SCCAC, we have provided:

- * 2 Crisis Intervention services
- * 27 families with Homeless Prevention services
- * 42 families with Household Stability services
- * 69 families with Water Bill Assistance/Shut-off Prevention
- * 21 families with Elderly & Disabled Minor Home Repair services
- * 7 households with Rental assistance
- * 4 households with Neighborhood Enhancements
- * 209 Senior Citizens with Independent Living services
- * Over 200 families with commodity boxes during our first quarter food distribution
